## What is Corsodyl 0.2% Mouthwash for?

The active ingredient is chlorhexidine digluconate which is an antibacterial agent that reduces the formation of dental plaque and is used to: • Treat & prevent gum disease (where gums may bleed when brushed) • Promote gum healing after dental surgery or treatment • Control mouth ulcers • Maintain mouth hygiene • Manage oral thrush and denture sore mouth

Use only if seal on cap is present and intact before opening.

• Use twice a day. Fill the cap to 10 ml line. Rinse mouth thoroughly for 1 minute then spit out.

• Do not swallow. • Do not use more mouthwash than the label tells you to.

Other ingredients: Glycerol, Macrogolglycerol Hydroxystearate, Sorbitol Liquid (Non-Crystallising),

Active ingredient: Chlorhexidine Digluconate 0,2% w/v.

Peppermint Flavour and Purified Water. Macrogolglycerol Hydroxystearate may cause skin reactions.
